What could others do that would help you understand?

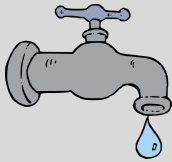
What could others do that would help you talk?

Talk to me:

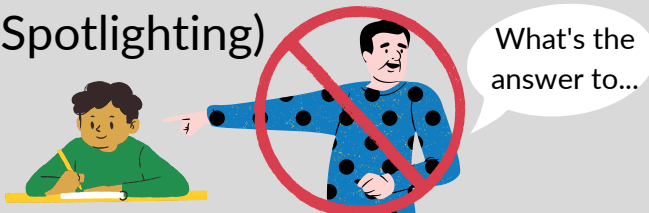
in a group

Quietly get my attention before talking to me.

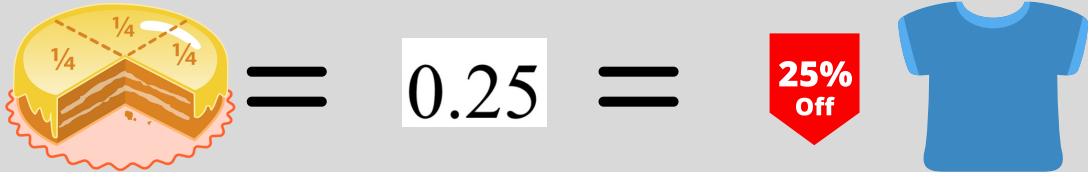

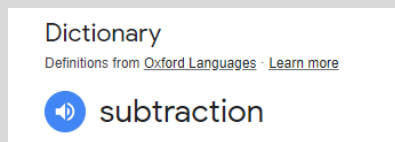
# When I'm learning new things:



Show me how it fits with something I already know.



Help me understand what a new word means



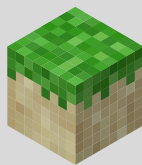
It means the same as 'minus'. We take something away...

Help me add new words into my day.



You could say it *subtracted* from what you did.

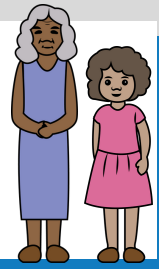
I want to pick new topics to talk and learn about.



Ask me *how* I can show you what I know.

Ok. Remember the math problems we did last week. We're going to grab our math book...

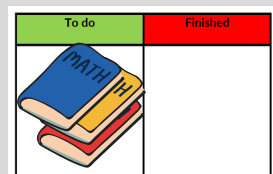
